<b>Program Significance to the Community</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Emphasis the need to continue efforts to provide teens the information and services they need to make and implement responsible decisions about their sexual behaviors.</li><li>• Adolescents are able to delay pregnancy and are able to embrace opportunities to achieve their personal goals.</li><li>• Knowledge gained on preventing pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases to ensure a health and productive life.</li><li>• Knowledge gained on a broad range of issues dealing with human sexuality.</li><li>• The program strengthens families and helps adolescents succeed by providing opportunities for parents and adolescents to reach agreement through counseling and/or referral services at the clinic.</li><li>• Ensures confidentiality enabling adolescents a place to seek services and counseling regarding sexuality issues.</li><li>• Encourages parental involvement in decision making process.</li><li>• The program is not duplicated in Laramie County.</li><li>• Adolescents would find to difficult at best to receive reproductive health care services without this program.</li><li>• The consequences of too early childbearing and/or early sexual activity are devastating and far-reaching for adolescents.</li></ul>
